HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

he idea for institutionalizing Babcock University Centre for Open Distance and e-Learning (BUCODeL) was first conceived in 2008 when the then Dean of the School of Education and Humanities, Prof David Kunle Akanbi organized the first sensitization workshop on Open Distance and e-Learning on the 28th April 2008 in collaboration

with the Department of Educational Technology, Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife. The University senate approved the appointment of the inaugural Director of the Centre, in person of Prof David Kunle Akanbi in September 2009, and institutionalized the directorate of the Babcock Centre for Open Distance and e-Learning.

The Centre within the past thirteen years has concentrated primarily on manpower capacity building and curriculum development.

To date, BUCODeL has organized over twenty (20) trainings and workshops including Train the Trainer workshops on Course Content Development, Overview of ODL, **Technology** Enabled Learning, Curriculum Writing Workshops, use of LMS, Open Educational Resources (OER), Simulated Online Instruction, among others.



HISTORICAL OVERVIEW CONTD.

Of interest are two trainings funded by the Commonwealth of Learning (COL) which includes Instructional (Re)Designing of Course Materials and more recently Sensitisation Workshop on Authentic Assessment in Dual – Mode Universities in Nigeria. Over eighty (80) content writers and staff of the Centre and the university at large have benefitted from these trainings.

The NUC approval was secured August 3rd, 2021. The Centre commenced learning activities with BSc Accounting on November 1st 2021.


